Bring on the virtuosos! *Hilary Hahn* performs the Paganini Caprice #24. String players: notice the bow control (equal facility on up and down bowing), her left arm effortlessly moving under the instrument syncing with the string level her bow is on, flawless execution of double stops of intervals from 3rds to 10ths, nice, even vibrato (pinky, too!), and incredible coordination and speeds of spiccato and left-handed pizzicato.


