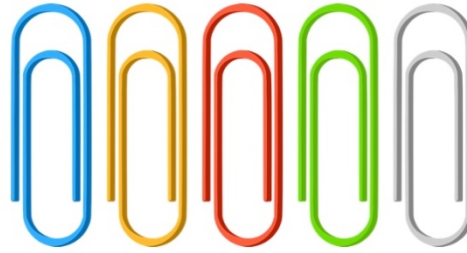

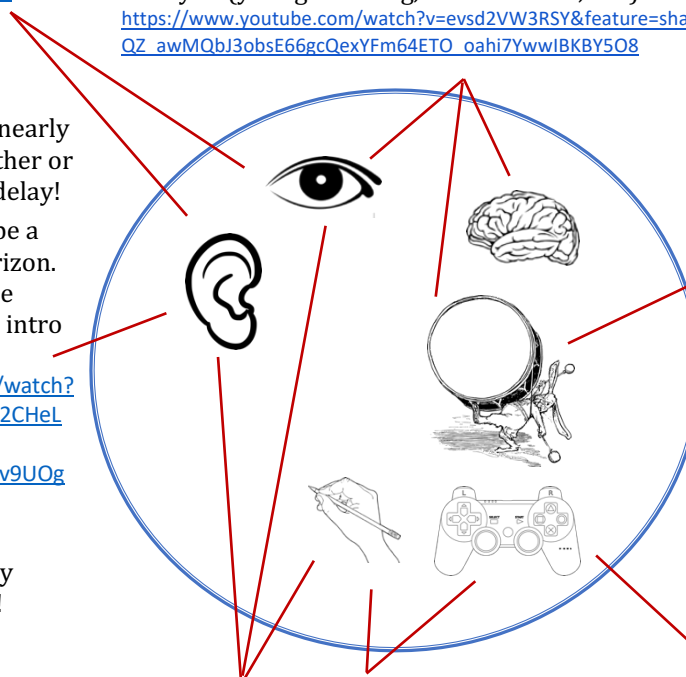
12-Tone Sudoku
